# Options for Consolidation in Local Government: A Fresh Look



ACELG has released the results of a major collaborative research venture between the Centre, Local Government Association of South Australia and Local Government New Zealand.

The research project takes a fresh look at the issue of consolidation in local government. The research examines a wide range of options that may deliver economies of scale or scope, or other benefits directed towards more effective local government. Options investigated included a range of approaches to shared services delivery, various models of regional collaboration, boundary adjustment, and voluntary, forced and failed amalgamations of councils.


In producing the report, the Centre used a number of research methods, including:

- Reviewing the available local and international literature
- Conducting a series of 'on ground' case studies in areas which have recent experience with consolidation, in both Australia and New Zealand
- Interviewing key opinion-makers who have recent experience in consolidation.



## Local Government Climate Change Roundtable



ACELG, with the support of the National Climate Change Adaptation Research Facility, hosted a climate change roundtable on the 4th May, to

review the current status of climate change research, policy and practice at the local level. The Roundtable was attended by a broad cross section of local government organisations.

The Director of the ACELG, Professor Graham Sansom said "It's important for local government to consider whether new structures are needed to ensure an effective national local government voice on climate change, particularly in light of the loss of the former Cities for Climate Protection Program."

Key actions agreed to by the roundtable were to seek to ensure that nationally consistent frameworks are developed for use by local government, that platforms for sharing innovation and new ideas around climate change action are established, and that local government takes more of the

lead role in setting the research agenda.

### Women in Local Government



Councillor Janet Davidson, Deputy President of ALGWA addressed the Women in Local Government breakfast at the LGMA National Conference in Cairns this

week. CIr Davidson informed the breakfast that over 100 councils were registered for the program and that the first councils were soon to receive their Silver Accreditations. In the same week, Program Coordinator Karen Purser addressed a national conference on Government Recruitment and Retention. Karen detailed the business case for gender equity, and drew attention to the changing nature of leadership required if councils are to become agile organisations, able to respond quickly to the changing needs of their communities.


Many councils have provided positive feedback on their participation in the program. While some councils have found that participation has supported their current gender equity practices, others have found that it has provided the framework under which those practices can be developed. Several have found that their ability to attract top female candidates for positions has been enhanced through the program.
