# LG Workforce in Context

- Total national LG workforce approx 190,000
- Total national resource sector workforce 180,000\*

# LG Workforce in Context

- Some things we need to know about our LG WF:
  - How many people work in LG?
  - What are their occupations and qualifications?
  - Which occupations experience skills shortages?
  - How many staff are undertaking training?
  - How much is LG spending on training?
  - What is the rate of turnover in LG?
  - How many women work in LG; how many are managers?
  - How many Indigenous people work in LG?
  - Analyse nationally, by state and by region.

# LG Workforce in Context

- Some key issues councils face in WF planning are:
  - Ensuring Council has the skills needed
  - Workforce development – investing in training
  - Workforce diversity – women, Indigenous and cultural
  - Knowledge retention – planning for an ageing workforce

# ALGWE Census

- Funded by the Australian Government's Local Government Reform Fund
- One of several complementary reforms – improvements in financial and asset management and community engagement that aim to build LG capacity
- By strengthening LG, we can better engage and empower local communities; we can craft local solutions to local problems; and enhance LG's capacity to respond to natural disasters.

- **A Corporate services/governance** (includes finance, customer service, IT, councillor support, strategy and policy, community engagement, communications, contracts, procurement)
- **B Engineering/infrastructure** (includes traffic, engineering and technical services, roads, waste, design and architecture etc.)
- **C Human/community services** (includes human resources, community development, organisational performance, libraries, child care, recreation – including pools etc.)
- **D Planning and environment** (includes strategic planning, land use, regulatory services including rangers, parking officers etc., development, town planners, natural resource management, environment and sustainability)
