

Background

- Formerly known as the National Minimum Dataset
- An initiative of the former Local Government and Planning Ministers' Council
- A key component of the National Workforce Strategy
- Consultation with state and NT local government associations, LGMA, ASU, jurisdictions
- Funded by the Australian Government
- Co-ordinated by ACELG



What the census seeks to achieve

- Collection of standardised workforce data from all 565 councils
- Data will be used to:
 - Improve workforce planning and development in LG
 - Support sector-wide and jurisdictional efforts to address skills shortages
 - Facilitate workforce diversity
 - Develop and maintain nationally consistent database on women's participation



Project status

- Dataset has been finalised following considerable consultation
- Pilot councils recruited and pilot surveys undertaken in councils
- Census has now commenced and is open to 21
 December



Dataset

- Elected reps by age and gender
- Mayor by gender and method of election
- Staff (headcount) by gender and highest post school qualification
- Occupation (headcount) by age and gender
- Commencements and separations by occupation, age and gender
- Management level by area of council business by gender
- Directly employed apprentices by occupation/trade

Dataset (cont.)

- Study/training support by occupation and gender
- Organisation training budget
- Total payroll as supplied to ABS for earnings survey
- Total positions vacant:
 - Vacant < 6 months
 - Vacant 6-12 months by top three occupations
 - Vacant > 12 months by top three occupations
- Workforce planning status
- Diversity targets



Support provided

- Detailed census guide for all councils
- "Sandpit" tool
- Blog website with FAQs and an area to post questions







Reports

- Each council will receive a print out of their own data
- No council will be able to access another council's data
- ACELG will analyse the data and provide reports
- Councils will receive reports for their ACLG classification, RDA region, state/territory and national
- Data will not be used as a "league table" for council comparison
