



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## city vs country




Care distribution:


She said that previously the centre's early childhood educators could refer people to a crisis counsellor at the nearby community centre, but that was being redeveloped as a community hub.



# Aged Care

## We are old and getting older

- Life expectancy for women 84 years
- For men 79 years
- Type of care is changing:
  - Home-based supported care
  - Later entry to facility care, and likely to be older and in quite poor health



The association's chair Liz Wolfe said factors like the growth of private meal delivery companies had led to a fall in demand

"Our 80 volunteers will be absorbed into the new model," she said.

"It will run the same as it always has, just under new management."

Holdsworth chief executive Michael Ryan said the state department of Ageing, Disability and Home Care approached the centre six months ago to develop the new model. He said deliveries would continue for house-bound clients who are unable to visit the cafe.

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## Mental Health

# 1 in 2 adults (45%) - a mental disorder in their lifetime

- 1 in 5 adults(20%) will experience symptoms in any given year
- Mental illnesses are the highest occurring non-fatal disease (24%)
- Schizophrenia represents 33% of conditions cared for through community services
  - Depression, anxiety and sleep disorders are most commonly treated by GPs (account for 60% of all mental health care)








## Aboriginals and **Torres Strait Islanders**


- 1.356 million workers up 4.6% against zero workforce growth across all industries in 2011
