- to further develop local governments' capability as an equal partner in Australia's and New Zealand's public sector.

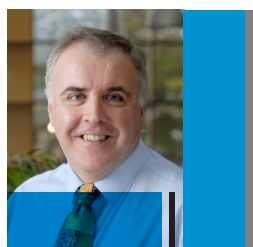
The *Excellence in Local Government Leadership Program* is:

## Who should attend?

The course is designed specifically for senior executives and elected members in local government in Australia and New Zealand.

## Learning approach

The format is tailored to the needs and capacities of senior leaders in local government. The emphasis is not on 'one way' didactic lectures, but on interaction between presenters and participants, and among participants. Case study discussions, exercises, small group work, peer clinics and other formats draw on participants' experience and knowledge and challenge them to stretch their intellectual boundaries.
