

## **LOCAL GOVERNMENT FACT SHEET 2:**

## Local Government employees – Level of post-school qualifications by gender

- 1. According to the 2006 Census, 81,174 (60%) of local government employees have post school qualifications (see table below). A slightly greater proportion of female employees (61%) have post school qualifications than males (59%). 17% of females have a bachelor degree compared with 12% of males.
- 2. The Council of Australian Government has established goals to:
  - a) Halve the proportion of Australians ages 20-64 without qualifications at Certificate III level and above between 2009 and 2020.
  - b) Double the number of higher qualification completions (diploma and advanced diploma) between 2009 and 2020.<sup>1</sup>
- 3. To meet these goals within its own workforce local government would need to:
  - a) Increase the number of local government employees with qualifications at Certificate III level and above by at least 28, 560 (i.e. half of 2,456 + 54,664) between 2009 and 2020.
  - b) Increase the number of higher qualification completions (diploma and advanced diploma) amongst local government employees by at least 14,404 between 2009 and 2020.
